- Certifying Agency: <u>AMBER Alert Training and Technical Assistance Program</u>, A US Department of Justice Initiative, administered through the National Criminal Justice Training Center of Fox Valley Technical College

• WHAT IS C.A.R.T.?

- A formalized multi-agency response to abducted, missing and endangered child cases in a dynamic, timely and efficient manner
- Team consists of nearly 80 dedicated members Federal, State, and local agencies within Shasta,
 Siskiyou, and Tehama Counties
- o CART follows the California **Amber Alert** requirements for activation

WHY C.A.R.T.?

- First few hours are critical
- 58,200 children are victims of non-family abductions each year
- 100-200 of these are stereotypical kidnappings
- Approximately ½ of these victims are sexually assaulted during the commission of the crime.
- o 74% are murdered within 3 hours
- o 91% are murdered with 24 hours
- 99% are murdered within 7 days
- o May agencies have never had a child abduction in their jurisdiction
- o Most officers responding to a child abduction have never investigated an abduction
- Inter-agency approach provides expert resources to augment organized investigation
- Assures victim family and community that all resources available were utilized for the successful recovery of the child
